

Definition of a small farmer based on:

Republic Act 7607 – Magna Carta for Small Farmers:

"natural persons dependent on small-scale subsistence farming as their primary source of income and whose sale, barter or exchange of agricultural products do not exceed a gross value of ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY THOUSAND PESOS (PhP 180,000) per annum based on 1992 constant prices."

Definition of a farmer, farmers' cooperatives and farmers and fisherfolk organizations and associations based on:

Republic Act No. 10000 – Agri-Agra Law:

"a farmer is defined as a natural person whose primary livelihood is cultivation of land or the production of agricultural crops, agro-forest products, livestock and/or fisheries, either by himself/herself, or primarily with the assistance of his/her immediate farm household, whether the land is owned by him/her or by another person under a leasehold or share tenancy agreement or arrangement with the owner thereot."

"a farmer's cooperative on the other hand refers to organizations composed primarily of small agricultural producers, farmers, farm workers, or other agrarian reform beneficiaries who voluntarily organize themselves for the purpose of pooling land, manpower, technological, financial or other economic resources, and operate on the principle of one member, one vote. A juridical person may be a member of a cooperative, with the same rights and duties as a natural person."

"farmers' and fisherfolk organizations or associations refer to farmers' and fisherfolk cooperatives, associations or corporations duly registered with appropriate government agencies and which are composed primarily of small agricultural producers, farmers, farmworkers, agrarian reform beneficiaries, fisherfolk who voluntarily join together to form business enterprises or non-business organizations which they themselves own, control or pation to



	For sugar cane production, the DA, DAR and DENR jointly promote block farming. Not only are the agencies converging in this program but also the services they provided: production, infrastructural development, training, and creation/organizing of milling districts/block farms.
	DENR – provides financial and technical assistance to upland farmers and growers under its National Greening Program.
Infrastructure and Post-Harvest Development	DA – distributes postharvest equipment and machinery, such as net/laminated sacks, construction and rehabilitation of flatbed dryers, mechanical dryers, bag closers/baggers, threshers, combine harvesters, rice cutter/harvesters, shredders and moisture meters are distributed.
